Senator Hubert Humphrey To Dedicate Camp Island

Sen. Hubert Humphrey will dedicate Ohitika Island in ceremonies at 2 p.m., Sept. 9 at Camp Courage.

The 17-acre island was acquired by the Minnesota Society for Crippled Children and Adults, Inc., from the federal government for use in the recreational program at Camp Courage. Sen. Humphrey was instrumental in obtaining the island and donated the purchase price to the Society.

The Sept. 9 ceremonies will be sponsored by the Minnesota Association of Moose Lodges, and has been devel-

oped by the Moose association for use as an overnight camping area. A permanent structure has been completed, which will be called "Moose Lodge" at a cost of about \$10,000.

Melvin Volhaber, past president of the Minnesota society and chairman of the project, will be master of ceremonies. David J. Wick, Albert Lea, president of the society, and Paul Scudder, director of Camp Courage, will formally accept the lodge.

The program is open to the public.
